Intestinal and anorectal motility and functional disorders. Motility and functional disorders of the small intestine, the colon and the anorectum can induce or contribute to symptoms such as diarrhoea, constipation and abdominal pain and may impair nutrient absorption in severe cases.

The 2 functional anorectal pain disorders (chronic proctalgia and proctalgia fugax) are distinguished on the basis of duration, frequency, and characteristic quality of pain. It is necessary to exclude other causes of anorectal pain such as ischemia, fissures, and inflammation.

Functional Anorectal Disorders - Gastroenterology

Currently, high-resolution anorectal manometry (HRAM) is used to determine anorectal pressure and has been considered a first-line diagnostic method for patients with functional defecation disorder. 6 HRAM has several advantages, like providing greater physiologic resolution, minimizing movement artifact, etc. Therefore, HRAM is expected to help increase the diagnostic accuracy and finally direct the optimal therapy for patients with functional defecation disorders.

Testing of anorectal function and structure is indicated to investigate patients with faecal incontinence and/or an evacuation disorder who do not respond to conservative therapies Owing to the complex nature of continence and evacuation, a number of investigations are required to assess not only the structure, but also the motor and sensory function of the anorectum

A new dynamic technique for the investigation of anorectal function has been developed. This involves radiological visualization of the rectum during voiding of a semisolid radio-opaque contrast medium, and simultaneous measurement of the intrarectal pressure and electrical activity of the external anal sphincter.

Anorectal sensitivity and compliance: visceral hypersensitivity, an exaggerated perception of stimuli encompassing both allodynia and hyperalgesia, is one of the main hallmarks of functional gastrointestinal disorders. 24 IBD patients with active or inactive disease have been shown to have continuous release of inflammatory mediators which can give rise to sensorimotor alterations in the gut, and development of visceral

hypersensitivity.

Anorectal function tests (comprising anorectal manometry, the rectal sensory test, and the balloon expulsion test) are commonly used to evaluate patients with symptoms of anorectal dysfunction; however, practice varies significantly.

These guidelines summarize the definitions, diagnostic criteria, differential diagnoses, and treatments of a group of benign disorders of anorectal function and/or structure. Disorders of function include defecation disorders, fecal incontinence, and proctalgia syndromes, whereas disorders of structure include anal fissure and hemorrhoids.

Background. Frequent observation of abnormal manometric patterns consistent with dyssynergia in healthy volunteers has warranted the need for reassessment of the current methods to enhance the diagnostic value of anorectal manometry in functional defecatory disorders. Whether rectal distention at simulated evacuation will affect anorectal pressure profile and increase rectoanal gradient is not known.
